Family and graduates will re-

Assistant Principal Patrick Kania will be on the stage reading the names of the graduates along with all of their awards and scholarships, while Cooley will go down the line of cars and give out the diplomas.

The graduation music will be prerecorded and played as transition pieces. Ben Penrose, class president, will give a speech, followed by a combined speech from Mara Berry and Megan Berry, the valedictorian and salutatorian, followed by a speech from Principal Cooley.

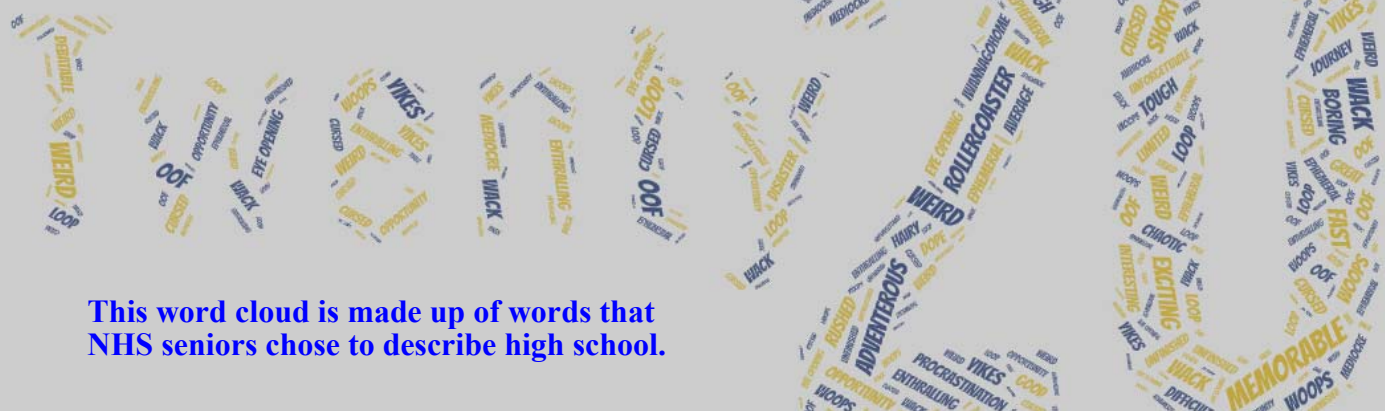
The ceremony will be professionally recorded and streamed live.

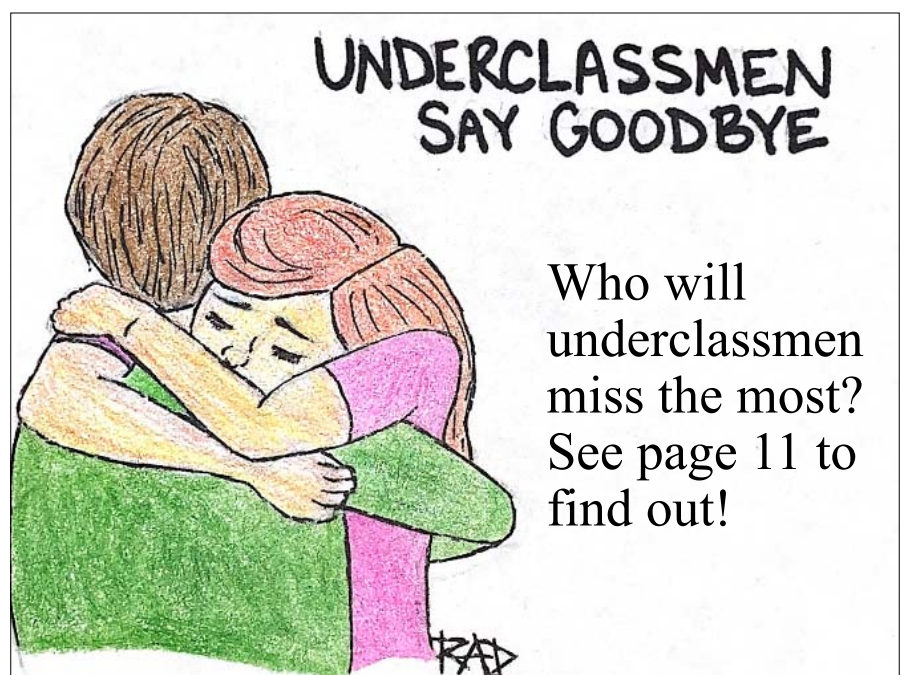

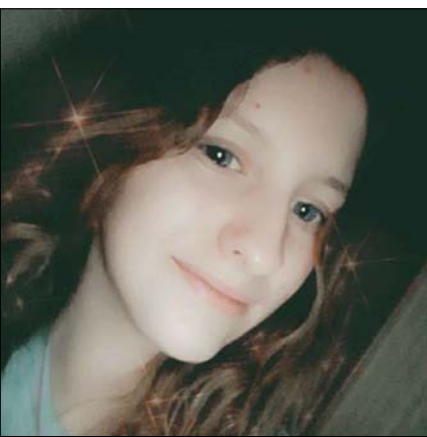

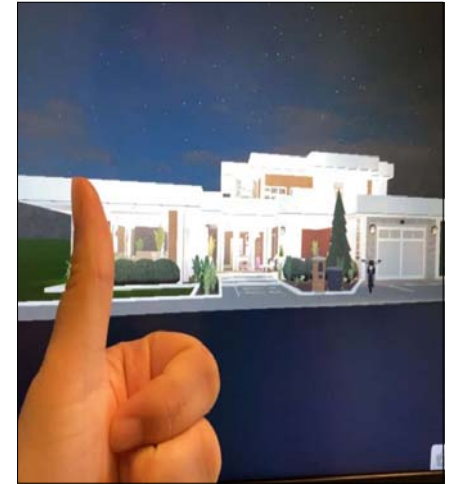
Morgan Booth-

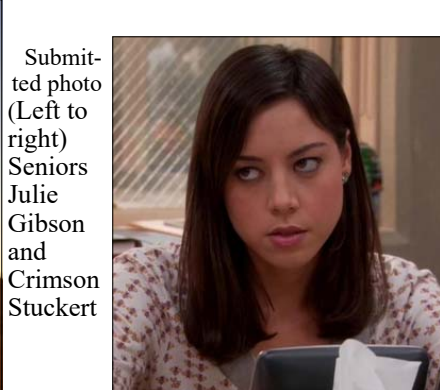
