TITLE I PROGRAMS

The Title I program is based on an annual assessment of educational needs. This assessment includes identification of educationally deprived children in the public and private schools in this District. Title I services are provided to all eligible, educationally deprived students in grades Kindergarten through grade eight.


The Board believes parental involvement is a vital part of the Title I program. Parental involvement shall include, but not be limited to, parental contribution to the design and implementation of programs under this title, participation by parents in school activities and programs, and training and materials which build parents' capacity to improve their children's learning in both the home and the school. To build a partnership between home and school, the District:

- 1. informs the parents of the program the reasons for their children's participation and the specific instructional objectives;
- 2. when applicable trains parents to work with their children to attain instructional objectives;
- 3. trains teachers and other staff involved in programs under this title to work effectively with the parents of participating students;
- 4. when applicable develops partnerships by consulting with parents regularly;
- 5. provides opportunities for parents to be involved in the design, operation and evaluation of the program and
- 6. provides opportunities for the full participation of parents who lack literacy skills or whose native language is not English.

Title I funds are used only to augment, not to replace, state and local funds. The Board uses such funds to provide educational services in schools receiving Title I assistance and funds are used to provide comparable services in all schools receiving Title I assistance.

During the 2020-2021 school year, Title I funds were used to pay for services at Maplehurst Elementary, Pleasant Elementary, League Elementary and Main Street school.

Norwalk City School District educational programs and activities are provided without regard to race, color, national origin, sex or handicap for all students. This policy of non-discrimination is in accordance with Title VI of Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. The Compliance Coordinator for Title VI is the Superintendent, and the Compliance Coordinator for Title IX and Section 504 is Jennifer King, Director of Pupil Services.


SCHOOL CLOSING MESSAGES

When it is necessary to close the schools due to inclement weather conditions, the Norwalk City School District will utilize "One Call Now" (our school information calling system) to notify each student's household. You may also tune your radio to WLKR, FM 95.3 and AM 1510.

The decision to close will be made as early as possible each morning. Please do not call the radio station or school officials.

If you do not receive a call or hear an announcement on WLKR that your school is closed, then school will be open.

Make up days for inclement weather days used in excess of 5 days will be March 14, June 3, 6, 7, 8 as needed, until all days are made up.



State Testing

The Norwalk City School District deploys a comprehensive testing program mandated by State of Ohio statutes. Over the course of school year 2021-2022 students will participate in testing measures listed:

*Grade K = Kindergarten Readiness Assessment

- *Grades 3 to 8 = Tests of achievement in math and reading language arts
- *Grades 5 and 8 = Tests of achievement in science

*Grades 9 to 12 = End-of-course tests in English language arts

I and II, algebra I, geometry (or integrated mathematics I and II), biology, American history and American government.

*ELPA21 (Formally OTELA) = Testing for English Language Learners

* AASCD = Testing for Students with Significant Cognitive Disabilities *Diagnostic Assessments = Grades K, 1, 2, and 3 as mandated

Additional and comprehensive mandated testing information may be found on the Ohio Department of Education website. Once posted the results of state assessments will be posted on the Norwalk City School District's Local Report Card on the Ohio Department of Education's website.



Rules for Riding the School Bus

Norwalk City School District **Pupil Transportation and Safety Rules**

- Pupils shall arrive at the bus stop before the bus is scheduled to arrive.
- Pupils must wait in a designated place of safety clear of traffic and away from the bus stops.
- Behavior at the school bus stop must not threaten life, limb or property of any individual.
- Pupils must go directly to an available or assigned seat so the bus may safely resume motion.
- Pupils must remain seated keeping aisles and exits clear.
- Pupils must observe classroom conduct and obey the driver promptly and respectfully. Talking is not permitted at railroad crossings.
- Pupils must not use profane language.
- Pupils must refrain from eating and drinking on the bus except as required for medical reasons.
- Pupils must not use tobacco, vaping, etc. on the bus.
- Pupils must not have alcohol or drugs in their possession on the bus except for prescription medication required for a student.





- Pupils must not throw or pass objects on, from or into the bus.
- Pupils may carry on the bus only objects that can be held in their laps.
- Pupils must leave or board the bus at locations to which they have been assigned unless they have parental and administrative authorization to do otherwise. Parents will need to call the Transportation Office at 419-660-1822 for approval of any Transportation changes.
- Pupils must not put head or arms out of the bus windows.
- Pupils who violate any of the Norwalk City School District Pupil Transportation and Safety Rules will receive the following correspondence and discipline actions; 1st Offense-Verbal Warning, 2nd Offense-Written Warning, 3rd Offense-2-day suspension from School Transportation, 4th offense-5-day suspension from School Transportation, 5th offense-possible 180-day suspension from School Transportation. These may change due to the severity of the issue.

The Norwalk City School District uses an automated calling system called "One Call Now" to notify parents about the school closings and delays. This system will also be used to communicate in the event of a school emergency. Parents are automatically entered into the system using the contact information provided at enrollment. Parents that have opted out of the service will not receive notifications. Please contact your student's school with any questions and to keep contact information current.

This year the Norwalk City School District will continue to partner with a coalition of schools and organizations to implement a Developmental Asset program in Huron County. The Search Institute in Minneapolis, Minnesota, has surveyed over two million youth across the United States and Canada. Researchers have learned about the experiences, attitudes, behaviors, and the number of developmental assets at work for these young people. As the result of this research, the Search Institute has identified 40 developmental assets. Their research indicates that there is a strong and consistent relationship between the number of assets present in young peoples' lives and the degree to which they develop in positive and healthful ways. Results show that the greater the number of developmental assets possessed by young people, the more positive and successful their development. The fewer the number of assets, the greater the possibility that young people will engage in risky behaviors. On the monthly calendar pages that follow, a different developmental asset category will be highlighted with suggestions on building that particular asset. Building assets in youth is everyone's responsibility. Make a difference - become as asset builder.
