SEARCH FOR CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES

The Norwalk City School District seeks to identify, locate and evaluate all children from birth to age 21 who may have a disability.

A "child with disability" in Ohio means a child under age twenty-two who has an intellectual disability, a hearing impairment (including deafness), a speech or language impairment, a visual impairment (including blindness), a serious emotional disturbance, an orthopedic impairment, autism, traumatic brain injury, and other health impairment, a specific learning disability (including dyslexia), deaf-blindness, a developmental delay (for a child between the ages of three and five), or multiple disabilities; and who, by reason thereof, needs special education and related services. Parents may not be aware that their child has a disability or that there are programs and services available.

Parents, relatives, public and private agency employees, and concerned citizens, are asked to help find any child who may have a disability and need special education and related services.

Notify the Norwalk City School District Department of Pupil Services at 419-668-2779. District officials will talk with the parents to determine if an evaluation is necessary.
