



# Norwalk City School District

# ACADEMICS

Providing our students the skills to succeed in the path of their choice



## Elementary



- ⇒ Little Free Library at Maplehurst Elementary
- ⇒ All Day Every Day Kindergarten
- ⇒ 100% in 2016 and 99% in 2017 3rd grade students promoted to 4th grade
- $\Rightarrow$  Pleasant Elementary has placed 2nd through 6th place every year in the Sum-Dog Competition since 2012; the year they were National Champions
- $\Rightarrow$  In 2013, League Elementary was one of only 8 school buildings in the entire state of Ohio to be recognized as <u>BOTH</u> a School of Promise and a High Progress School of Honor.
- ⇒ New literacy programs for the 2017-2018 school year for grades K-4

## Main Street School

- ⇒ 5th and 6th grade exploratory classes, including music, art, computer, and STEM
- ⇒ 55% of students participate in "0 period" for band, choir, or orchestra
- ⇒ Blue Team (6th grade) piloting "Flipped Classroom" in all 4 core subjects
- ⇒ Rewards include a trip to watch Toledo Mud Hens baseball

## Norwalk Middle School

- ⇒ 14 electives with advanced courses in Algebra, French, Spanish, Math 7, Art 8
- ⇒ Programming for all students includes STEM/ Engineering/Robotics
- ⇒ Maker Space "Creation Station" in its second year
- ⇒ Use of "plicker cards" for assessments

## Norwalk High School

- ⇒ 1 National Merit Finalist and 4 Commended (past 5 years)
- $\Rightarrow$  124 courses offered | 2 World Languages offered: Spanish and French
- ⇒ 9 courses/31 credits of college credits available at the school
- ⇒ 69 students took 92 Advanced Placements exams in May 2017
- $\Rightarrow$  100 students took 200 College Credit Plus courses during the 2016-2017 school year
- ⇒ 115 students from NHS attend EHOVE Career Center
- $\Rightarrow$  75 local scholarships awarded to 37 members of the class of 2017, over \$80,000
- ⇒ ACT averages consistently above national averages: 2017: 21.6; 2016: 21.6; 2015: 22.4
- $\Rightarrow$  323 students participating in honors courses during the 2016-2017 school year



- ⇒ 4th grade students are learning coding/programming through the use of Sphero SPRK+ Robots
- $\Rightarrow$  5th and 6th grade students are using two and three dimensional design software as an introduction to laser cutting/engraving and 3D printing
- ⇒ 7th grade students complete four Project Lead the Way Gateway to Technology modules: Magic of Electrons, Energy and the Environment, Design and Modeling, and Automation and Robotics
- $\Rightarrow$  8th grade students can elect to continue their STEM education in an elective maker space class
- $\Rightarrow$  High School students have the opportunity to take classes in a new maker space as well as courses in engineering, industrial technology, digital arts, digital marketing and computer sci-
- $\Rightarrow$  Students in all grades have access to a new VR kit that will allow them to experience places and ideas like never before.
