Student Leadership Roles with PBIS

Maplehurst Elementary School will continue to maintain the Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (P.B.I.S.) program. A short explanation of PBIS is attached in a pamphlet. We will highlight and celebrate positive student behavior through our reward systems multiple times during the school year. P.B.I.S. also supplies students with skills to handle potentially negative situations and think about the best course of action.

Having a school-wide behavioral approach incorporates everyone. Students are able to see that we all support them and equally contribute to our school's success and safety. Our school wide expectations are to: **Be Safe, Be a Friend, and Be a Learner.**

The students, along with their teachers, have designed an expectation grid for the classroom, during lunch and playground, on the bus, in the restroom, and in the hallway.

Kindergarten Readness Assessment - Revised

Assessment Revised (KRA-R) is a tool that teachers will use to get to know your child. I<u>t is not designed to rank children by ability, nor is it a</u> <u>tool for identifying students with disabilities or gifted students.</u> This tool is primarily to help your teacher get to know your child in a way that does not interrupt the child's learning.

Your child may not even be aware that the teacher is using this tool because most of the tool requires the teacher to watch the student during the natural course of the school day's activities.

Don't be alarmed if your child is not excelling in every area. Most children develop in spurts. They are ahead of their peers in some areas and behind in others. But remember, this tool is not designed to compare your child with other children, it is used to indicate how ready your child is for learning Ohio's Learning Standards for kindergarten. All students will need support in some areas.
